ENGLISH

Outcome: Children will write poetry using rhymes and patterns. Children will write their own versions of familiar stories.

They should be able to:

- Say out loud what they are going to write about
- Compose a sentence orally before writing it
- Participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role-play/improvisations and debates
- Leave spaces between words

MATHS

Outcome: Children will become more proficient with the use of addition and subtraction.

They should be able to:

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs
- Measure and begin to record: lengths and heights.
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.
- Recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes
- Describe position, directions and movements, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

HISTORY

Outcome: Children will study the changes to toys throughout history to present day.

They should be able to:

- Use common words & phrases related to the passing of time.
- Find answers to some simple questions about the past from simple sources of information.
- Describe some simple similarities and differences between artefacts.
- Ask and answer relevant basic questions about the past and present.
- Say what's different between the past and present in my own and others' lives

ENGLISH

Outcome: Children will write information texts linked to topic.

They should be able to:

- Use a capital letter for names of people, places, the days of the week, and the personal pronoun 'I'
- Join words and joining clauses using "and"
- Begin to punctuate sentences using a capital letter, a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Outcome: Children will learn about the Christmas story.

They should be able to:

- Describe some religious ideas from stories
- Describe the importance of Jesus to Christians.

ART AND DESIGN

Outcome: Children will produce a portrait of a significant person in history.

They should be able to:

- Use artwork to record ideas, observations and experiences.
- Experiment with different designs and techniques to make different products.

PE

Outcome: Children will take part in exploring invasion games.

They should be able to:

- Explore ways of using a ball.
- Develop confidence throwing and catching.
- Develop coordination within throwing, catching and moving.

PSHE

Outcome: Children will learn about relationships.

They should be able to:

- Discuss different ways of managing our feelings and who can help us to feel safe and happy.
- Understand our own talents and abilities.
- Learn some ways of managing feelings of jealousy.
- Learn about the importance of a Growth Mind set and how

COMPUTING

Outcome: Children will learn about coding and create their own Beebot instructions.

They should be able to:

- Recognise the importance of e-safety.
- Recognise common uses of information technology in the home and school environment.
- Understand what algorithms are; how they are implemented as programs on digital devices; and that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions.

GEOGRAPHY:

Outcome: Children will learn about our local area.

They should be able to:

- Understand how some places are linked to other places e.g. roads, trains.
- Name, describe and compare familiar places.

Music

Outcome: Children will take part in singing simple songs.

They should be able to:

- Listen to, copy and repeat a simple rhythm or melody.
- Learn and follow the conductor or band leader.
- Understand that pitch describes how high or low sounds are.

SCIENCE

Outcome: Children will learn about different animals and their diets.

They should be able to:

- Ask simple questions and recognise that they can be answered in different ways.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
